- Federal law, EMTALA, mandates that emergency physicians and on-call specialists evaluate and stabilize any patient who presents to the ED
- With high risk clinical scenarios and associated high liability risk, poor reimbursement rate leaves consultants with little incentive to fill call rosters for emergency departments
- Lack of specialist availability leads to otherwise unnecessary transfers to obtain such stabilization care
- Emergency physicians are highly mobile, we are losing quality emergency physicians to IL and MN.
