You're working a busy 12 hour shift, and a patient with chief complaint of "SI" pops up on the board. Gulp. The evaluation is uniquely straightforward: this 54 year old female has a history of depression and is having passive thoughts of suicide in a stressful time, very clearly presents with her husband for

voluntary admission. No ED hold needed. You find no other medical concerns and even get her accepted at the nearest psych hospital promptly, which happens to be 50 miles away. Bingo bango, you're on a roll!

Then comes the question of what "mode of transportation" are you going to fill out on the EMTALA form? The patient just assumes that her husband can drive her there, but your hospital has a policy that all psych transfers must go by ambulance, sticking this family with a hefty bill. Your gut is that she is extremely low risk for harm or non-adherence to the care plan during private transport. Is there merit to insisting on ambulance transfer?
